This puzzle 28 extra words make it fun to play.

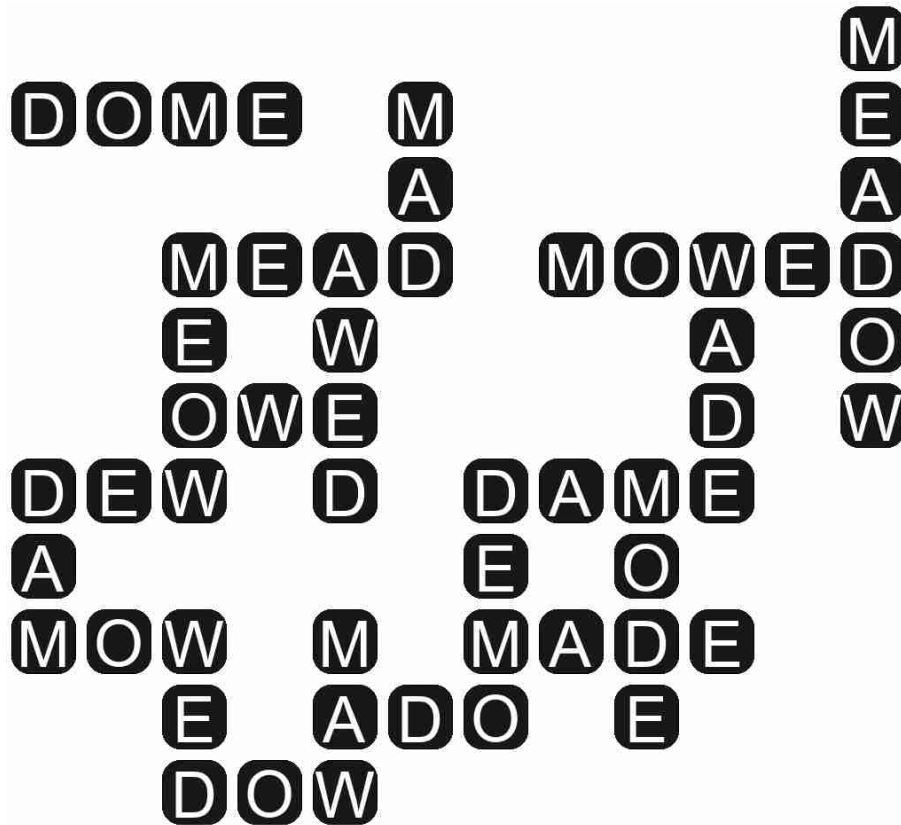
Reaching this point shows that you completed 43,765 words and 181,372 letters.

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Word definitions - wordscapes level 3764

DAM - Structure placed across a flowing body of water to stop the flow.

DEW - Moisture in the air that settles on plants, etc in the morning, resulting in drops.

MAD - Insane; crazy, mentally deranged.

OWE - To be under an obligation to give something back to someone or to perform some action for someone.

DOW - To be worth.

ADO - To do; in doing; as, there is nothing ado.

MOW - To cut something (especially grass or crops) down or knock down.

WED - To perform the marriage ceremony for; to join in matrimony.

MAW - The stomach, especially of an animal.

DEMO - A brief demonstration or visual explanation.

DOME - A common structural element of architecture that resembles the hollow upper half of a sphere, a cupola.

MADE - A maggot or grub.

MODE - One of several ancient scales, one of which corresponds to the modern major scale and one to the natural minor scale.

WADE - To walk through water or something that impedes progress.

DAME - The equivalent title to Sir for a female knight.

MEAD - An alcoholic drink fermented from honey and water.

MEOW - The cry of a cat.

AWED - Simple past tense and past participle of awe.

MEADOW - A field or pasture; a piece of land covered or cultivated with grass, usually intended to be mown for hay; an area of low lying vegetation, especially near a river.
