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Word definitions - wordscapes level 5572

KIT - A circular wooden vessel, made of hooped staves.

MOO - The characteristic sound made by a cow or bull.

SIM - A simulation.

SKI - One of a pair of long flat runners designed for gliding over snow.

TOO - Likewise.

KOI - Ornamental domesticated varieties of the common carp, *Cyprinus carpio*, of Japan and eastern Asia with red-gold or white coloring.

MIST - Water or other liquid finely suspended in air.

MOST - Superlative form of much.

OMIT - To leave out or exclude.

SKIM - To throw an object so it bounces on water (skimming stones).

SOOT - Fine black or dull brown particles of amorphous carbon and tar, produced by the incomplete combustion of coal, oil etc.

TOOK - Simple past of take.

MOOT - Subject to discussion (originally at a moot); arguable, debatable, unsolved or impossible to solve.

SKIT - A short comic performance.

MOIST - Slightly wet; characterised by the presence of moisture, not dry; damp.

MISTOOK - Simple past of mistake.
