This puzzle 17 extra words make it fun to play.


Reaching this point shows that you completed 10,096 words and 40,581 letters.

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# Word definitions - wordscapes level 897

ALL - Intensifier.

LAW - The body of rules and standards issued by a government, or to be applied by courts and similar authorities.

LOT - A large quantity or number; a great deal.

LOW - In a position comparatively close to the ground.

OWL - Any of various birds of prey of the order Strigiformes that are primarily nocturnal and have forward-looking, binocular vision, limited eye movement, and good hearing.

TOW - To pull something behind one using a line or chain; to haul.

TWO - Describing a set or group with two components.

ALT - A state of excitement, conveyed by a high pitched voice.

LAT - A Latvian coin and national monetary unit.

TALL - Obsequious; obedient.

TOLL - Loss or damage incurred through a disaster.

WALL - To boil.

ALTO - A musical part or section higher than tenor and lower than soprano, formerly the part that performed a countermelody above the tenor or main melody.

ALLOW - To grant, give, admit, accord, afford, or yield; to let one have.

ATOLL - A type of island consisting of a ribbon reef that nearly or entirely surrounds a lagoon and supports, in most cases, one to many islets on the reef platform. Atolls have a unique geology, so not all islands with a reef and a lagoon are atolls.

TALLOW - A hard animal fat obtained from suet etc.; used to make candles, soap and lubricants.
